CCV's Accounting program prepares you for entry-level positions in a variety of settings. It allows you to transfer to a bachelor's degree program or may be the first step in pursuing CPA licensure. In addition to taking courses in accounting, you will gain a broader knowledge of the business environment by studying technology, communication and management.
