

## SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES CERTIFICATE +

This certificate provides students with the knowledge and skills necessary for entry-level employment in the field of substance abuse and prepares students to take the Apprentice Addiction Professional (AAP) exam. Students may also use the certificate to enhance degrees in related fields such as Human Services, Social Work or Criminal Justice. Credits earned in the Substance Abuse Services Certificate may be applied to the educational training component of both the Apprentice Addiction Professional (AAP) Certification and the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor (ADC) Certification in the State of Vermont. However, certification in the field will require additional education credits, experience, and examinations beyond the Substance Abuse Services certificate. Students should consult the Vermont Alcohol and Drug Abuse Certification Board and CCV Substance Abuse Services webpage for further information.
